22	I. INTRODUCTION.		
23	Defendants have completed twenty-six of the twenty-seven court-ordered construction		
24	projects designed to serve the mental health treatment needs of the Coleman class. The final		
	project—construction of a treatment and office space building to serve the Enhanced Outpatient		
25	project—construction of a treatment and office s	pace building to serve the Emilaneed Outpatient

1	approving Defendants' activation schedule for this project to October 30, 2015. Good cause		
2	exists to grant this request due to delays beyond Defendants' control.		
3	Defendants met-and-conferred with Plaintiffs and, although Plaintiffs did not stipulate to		
4	the extension, Defendants do not anticipate that Plaintiffs will object. Defendants also conferred		
5	with the Special Master, who indicated he did not object to this requested extension.		
6 7	II. THERE IS GOOD CAUSE TO GRANT DEFENDANTS' REQUEST TO EXTEND THE TIME TO ACTIVATE THE TREATMENT AND OFFICE SPACE CONSTRUCTION PROJECT AT CCWF TO OCTOBER 30, 2015.		
8	On September 24, 2009, this Court ordered Defendants to file a detailed long-range		
9	construction plan, including activation schedules, with "a schedule with a date certain for		
10	completion of each project included in the long-range plan." (ECF No. 3686 at 3.) Defendants		
11	submitted their long-range construction plan on February 18, 2010. (ECF No. 3805.) All of the		
12	projects have been completed except construction of a new treatment and office space building		
13	serving the 54 Enhanced Outpatient Program-General Population inmates at CCWF. ( <i>Id.</i> at 6). <sup>1</sup>		
14	In May 2013, Defendants notified the Court that they expected construction to be completed by		
15	May 2015. (ECF No. 4623 at 3.) Construction began in December 2013. In January 2014,		
16	Defendants requested an extension of the activation date for this project to June 2015. (Defs.'		
17	Mot. Regarding Defs.' Long-Range Mental Health Bed Plan and Update to the Court, at 9, Jan.		
18	21, 2014, ECF No. 4984.) The Court granted the request on March 18, 2014. (ECF No. 5116.)		
19	Defendants now request a final extension to complete this project by October 30, 2015.		
20	Between April and July 2015, the project was delayed by issues with the contractor responsible		
21	for installing the fire alarm and difficulty in retaining union hall casual labor. (Decl. of Dean		
22	Borg at ¶ 5.) Additionally, during August and September 2015, Defendants encountered		
23	difficulty in scheduling the State Fire Marshal's review of the project's fire alarm submittals, and		
24	inspection of the project. (Id. at § 6.) On September 17, 2015, the State Fire Marshal approved		
25	the low voltage fire alarm and control system plans. (Id.) The contractor anticipates it will		
26	<sup>1</sup> Defendants' initial plan added 70 Enhanced Outpatient Program-General Population bads at CCWE (Id). Defendants reassassed this project in light of the decreased population and		
27	beds at CCWF. ( <i>Id.</i> ) Defendants reassessed this project in light of the decreased population, and the Court approved Defendants' request to cancel this bed expansion. (ECF Nos. 4144 at 3:19-23 & 4195 at 12:6-11; <i>see also</i> ECF No. 4199 at ¶ 2.c.)

1	complete construction by October 5, 2015, assuming a successful State Fire Marshal inspection		
2	and resulting certificate of occupancy. (Id.) If construction is completed on this schedule, CDCR		
3	plans to begin treating patients in the new building on October 5, 2015. (Id.) CDCR's Executive		
4	Staff in the Facility Planning, Construction and Ma	nagement Division are closely monitoring the	
5	project to accelerate progress where ever possible. ( <i>Id.</i> at $\P$ 7.)		
6	III. CONCLUSION.		
7	Construction of the new treatment and office space at CCWF is nearly complete, and		
8	Defendants' request to extend the activation deadline for this project to October 30, 2015 should		
9	be granted. Defendants will continue to accelerate completion of this project, if feasible, and		
10	expect that patients will begin receiving treatment in the new facility by October 5, 2015.		
11	Defendants will also continue to submit to the Special Master an activation schedule until the		
12	project is complete.
