Plaintiff is a prisoner without counsel seeking relief for alleged civil rights violations. *See* 42 U.S.C. § 1983. On April 25, 2007, plaintiff filed a request for reconsideration of the magistrate judge’s order filed April 9, 2007, denying plaintiff’s request that the court appoint counsel. The Local Rules of this Court state that a magistrate judge’s orders will be upheld unless “clearly erroneous or contrary to law.” L. R. 72-303(f). Therefore, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, upon reconsideration, the order of the magistrate judge filed April 9, 2007, is affirmed.
