made a substantial showing of the denial of a constitutional right." 28 U.S.C. § 2253(c)(2). The court must either issue a certificate of appealability indicating which issues satisfy the required

showing or must state the reasons why such a certificate should not issue. See Fed. R. App. P.

Doc. 67

22(b); <u>but see Woods v. Carey</u>, 525 F.3d 886 (9th Cir. 2008) (citing <u>White v. Lambert</u>, 370 F.3d 1002, 1010 (9th Cir. 2004), and suggesting that a certificate of appealability is not required in cases where petitioner challenges the denial of parole). For the reasons set forth in the Magistrate Judge's May 22, 2009, findings and recommendations, petitioner has not made a substantial showing of the denial of a constitutional right.

Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that petitioner's request for a certificate of appealability (Doc. 66) is denied.
