Plaintiff, a former state prisoner proceeding pro se, brings this civil rights action pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983. Pending before the court is plaintiff's motion for a stay of these proceedings (Doc. 540).

The undersigned finds no reason to stay these proceedings. The filing of a writ of habeas corpus, by definition, is a challenge to a conviction. Such a challenge would have no impact on this case, which challenges the treatment plaintiff received while in custody. Thus, there is no basis on which to grant plaintiff's request.
