23	controversy remains for the court to adjudicate.	
24	Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that:	
25	1. Petitioner's motion to dismiss the amended habeas corpus application (ECF No. 225)	
26	be granted.	
27	2. The Clerk of Court be directed to close this case.
