16	Plaintiff, a state prisoner proceeding pro se, has filed this civil rights action
17	seeking relief under 42 U.S.C. § 1983. The matter was referred to a United States Magistrate
18	Judge pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(B) and Local General Order No. 262.
19	On June 17, 2009, the magistrate judge filed findings and recommendations
20	herein which were served on all parties and which contained notice to all parties that any
21	objections to the findings and recommendations were to be filed within twenty days. Plaintiff,
22	who was granted an extension of time to do so, has filed objections to the findings and
23	recommendations, to which defendants have filed their response.
24	In accordance with the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(C) and Local Rule 72-
25	304, this court has conducted a <u>de novo</u> review of this case. Having carefully reviewed the

9	B. Granted as to (Acting) Warden Walker, in his individual capacity;
10	C. Denied as to defendants Haythorne and Hague; and
11	D. Denied as to defendant Walker, in his official capacity only.
