17	Plaintiff, a state prisoner proceeding pro se and in forma pauperis, brings this civil
18	rights action pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983. Pending before the court is plaintiff's request for an
19	injunction (Doc. 89).
20	Plaintiff has filed this request for injunctive relief against individuals who are not
21	named as defendants in this action. This court is unable to issue an order against individuals who
22	are not parties to a suit pending before it. See Zenith Radio Corp. v. Hazeltine Research, Inc.,
23	395 U.S. 100, 112 (1969). The request must, therefore, be denied, but without prejudice to
24	plaintiff's right to seek relief in a separate civil rights action against those individuals he claims
25	are retaliating against him.

1	Based on the foregoing, the undersigned recommends that plaintiff's request for
2	injunctive relief (Doc. 89) be denied.
3	These findings and recommendations are submitted to the United States District
4	Judge assigned to the case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1). Within 20 days
5	after being served with these findings and recommendations, any party may file written
6	objections with the court. The document should be captioned "Objections to Magistrate Judge's
