Petitioner, a state prisoner proceeding with appointed counsel, brings this petition for a writ of habeas corpus pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2254 challenging the denial of parole. Respondent has filed a notice with the court that Petitioner has been granted parole and released from custody.


