20	a recommendation that this action be dismissed. The thirty day period has now expired, and
21	plaintiff has not responded to the court's order and has not filed an in forma pauperis affidavit
22	and certified copy of his prison trust account statement.
23	According, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court is directed to
24	randomly assign a United States District Judge to this action;
25	IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed without
26	prejudice.

1	These findings and recommendations are submitted to the United States District
2	Judge assigned to the case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(l). Within twenty
3	days after being served with these findings and recommendations, plaintiff may file written
