20	a recommendation that this action be dismissed. The thirty day period has now expired, and
21	plaintiff has not responded to the court's order and has not filed a completed affidavit in support
22	of his request to proceed in forma pauperis along with a certified copy his trust account
23	statement.
24	Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court is directed to
25	randomly assign a United States District Judge to this action;
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IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed without prejudice.
