without funds. Accordingly, the court will not assess an initial partial filing fee. 28 U.S.C. § 1915(b)(1). Plaintiff is obligated to make monthly payments of twenty percent of the

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preceding month's income credited to plaintiff's prison trust account. These payments shall be collected and forwarded by the appropriate agency to the Clerk of the Court each time the amount in plaintiff's account exceeds \$10.00, until the filing fee is paid in full. 28 U.S.C. \$ 1915(b)(2).

The complaint states a cognizable claim for relief pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983 and 28 U.S.C. § 1915A(b). If the allegations of the complaint are proven, plaintiff has a reasonable opportunity to prevail on the merits of his first, second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, eighth, tenth, eleventh, thirteenth, fourteenth, and fifteenth causes of action.

In accordance with the above, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

- 1. Plaintiff's request for leave to proceed in forma pauperis is granted.
- 2. Plaintiff is obligated to pay the statutory filing fee of \$350.00 for this action.
 The fee shall be collected and paid in accordance with this court's order to the Director of the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation filed concurrently herewith.
- 3. Service is appropriate for the following defendants: Villasenor, Virga, Ledesma, Fischer, Kisser, Berkler, Director of Corrections, Walker.
- 4. The Clerk of the Court shall send plaintiff eight USM-285 forms, one summons, an instruction sheet and a copy of the complaint filed February 6, 2009.
- 5. Within thirty days from the date of this order, plaintiff shall complete the attached Notice of Submission of Documents and submit the following documents to the court:
 - a. The completed Notice of Submission of Documents;
 - b. One completed summons;
 - c. One completed USM-285 form for each defendant listed in number 3 above; and
 - d. Nine copies of the endorsed complaint filed February 6, 2009.

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6. Plaintiff need not attempt s	ervice on defendants and need not request waiver or
service. Upon receipt of the above-described	documents, the court will direct the United States
Marshal to serve the above-named defendants	s pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 4
without payment of costs.
