Plaintiff, who is proceeding with retained counsel, brings this action for judicial review of a final decision of the Commissioner of Social Security under 42 U.S.C. § 405(g). On April 2, 2010, the court approved Plaintiff's stipulation extending the time for filing a motion for summary judgment to April 9, 2010. However, by May 5, 2010, no motion for summary judgment had been filed. The court then issued an order to show cause why this action should not be dismissed for Plaintiff's failure to file a dispositive motion.

Good cause appearing therefor, the order to show cause is discharged, and Plaintiff's motion for summary judgment is deemed properly filed. Defendant's cross-motion for summary judgment shall be filed pursuant to the time set forth in the court's scheduling order.
