19 20	IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED by and between the parties through their undersigned counsel, subject to the approval of the Court, that Plaintiff be awarded attorney fees under the Equal Access to Justice Act (EAJA), 28 U.S.C. § 2412(d), in the amount of FIVE THOUSAND		
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23	THREE DOLLARS AND 00 CENTS (\$5,300.00). This amount represents compensation for all		
24 25	legal services rendered on behalf of Plaintiff by counsel in connection with this civil action, in		
23 26	accordance with 28 U.S.C. § 2412(d).		
27	After the Court issues an order for EAJA fees to Plaintiff, the government will consider

the matter of Plaintiff's assignment of EAJA fees to Plaintiff's attorney. Pursuant to <u>Astrue v.</u>
<u>Ratliff</u>, 130 S. Ct. 2521 (2010), the ability to honor the assignment will depend on whether the
fees are subject to any offset allowed under the United States Department of the Treasury's Offset
Program. After the order for EAJA fees is entered, the government will determine whether they
are subject to any offset.

7 Fees shall be made payable to Plaintiff, but if the Department of the Treasury determines 8 that Plaintiff does not owe a federal debt, then the government shall cause the payment of fees, 9 expenses and costs to be made directly to Plaintiff's counsel, Bess M. Brewer, pursuant to the 10 11 assignment executed by Plaintiff. Any payments made shall be delivered to Plaintiff's counsel. 12 This stipulation constitutes a compromise settlement of Plaintiff's request for EAJA 13 attorney fees, and does not constitute an admission of liability on the part of Defendant under the 14 EAJA. Payment of the agreed amount shall constitute a complete release from, and bar to, any 15 16 and all claims that Plaintiff and/or Plaintiff's counsel may have relating to EAJA attorney fees in 17 connection with this action. 18 This award is without prejudice to the rights of Plaintiff's counsel to seek Social Security 19

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20 Act attorney fees under 42 U.S.C. § 406, subject to the provisions of the EAJA.
