- 5. The Clerk of the Court shall serve a copy of this order, a copy of the petition for writ of habeas corpus pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2254 (Doc. No. 1), and the court's form regarding consent or request for reassignment on Jennifer A. Neill, Supervising Deputy Attorney General.
