Plaintiff has paid the filing fee but has not responded to 19 the order to show cause. There is no subject matter jurisdiction evident in plaintiff's pleadings. 20 Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed 21 without prejudice. See Local Rule 110. 22 These findings and recommendations will be submitted to the United States 23 District Judge assigned to the case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(l). Within 24 fourteen days after being served with these findings and recommendations, plaintiff may file 25 written objections with the court. The document should be captioned "Objections to Magistrate Judge's Findings and Recommendations." Plaintiff is advised that failure to file objections 26
