Declaration of Taking and the deposit of estimated just compensation, title to the property described in the declaration is vested in the United States. The primary purpose of the Declaration of Taking Act is to give the government immediate possession of the property and give the owner immediate compensation, in the form of estimated value in return for title to the land. *United States v. Miller*, 317 U.S. 369 (1943). Thus, upon the filing of the Declaration of Taking, the United States is entitled to possession. *United States v. Cobb*, 328 F. 2d 115 (9<sup>th</sup> Cir. 1964); *Narramore v. United States*, 960 F. 2d 1048, 1050 (9<sup>th</sup> Cir. 1992).

The United States confirms that it needs immediate possession of the property because the Department of Energy wants to immediately commence and continue with construction of the power transmission system of the Central Valley Project, of which the line over the condemned property is an integral part. The construction contract has been awarded and the Department of Energy, through the Western Area Power Administration ("WAPA"), is prepared to move forward with construction immediately but cannot begin construction without access to and possession of the property.

Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that all defendants in this action, and all persons in possession or control of the property, described in the Complaint in Condemnation, shall immediately surrender possession of said property to Plaintiff upon service of a copy of this Order.
