Examination of the above-entitled actions reveals that these actions are related within the meaning of Local Rule 123 (E.D. Cal. 2005). 9 02619-LKK-EFB be reassigned to Judge John A. Mendez and Magistrate
10 Judge Kendall M. Newman for all further proceedings, and any dates
11 currently set in this reassigned case only are hereby VACATED.
12 Henceforth, the caption on documents filed in the reassigned case
13 shall be shown as 2:10-02619-CV-JAM-KJN.

14 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court make
15 appropriate adjustment in the assignment of civil cases to
16 compensate for this reassignment.

17 IT IS SO ORDERED.
