5	Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:
6	1. Within twenty-eight days of the date of this order, the state Attorney General,
7	or a designee, shall, if known, file a Suggestion of Death identifying plaintiff's successor or
8	representative. The Attorney General, or her designee, shall also, if practicable, also serve a copy
9	of the Suggestion of Death on plaintiff's successor;
10	2. The Clerk of the Court is directed to serve a copy of this order on Monica
11	Anderson, Supervising Deputy Attorney General; and
12	3. As plaintiff is evidently deceased, the Clerk of the Court is directed not to serve
13	a copy of this order upon him at the prison address, as the mail will simply be returned.
