15	Plaintiff, a prisoner without counsel, has filed a civil complaint. He has submitted an
16	affidavit requesting leave to proceed in forma pauperis pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915(a)(1). As
17	plaintiff is aware, section 1915(a)(2) states that "a prisoner seeking to bring a civil action
18	without prepayment of fees or security therefor, in addition to filing the affidavit filed under
19	paragraph (1), shall submit a certified copy of the trust fund account statement (or institutional
20	equivalent) for the prisoner for the 6-month period immediately preceding the filing of the
21	complaint , obtained from the appropriate official of each prison at which the prisoner is or
22	was confined." The court has previously informed plaintiff that he has not submitted a certified
23	copy of his trust account statement or the institutional equivalent and that he may comply with
24	this requirement by having prison officials complete the "Certificate" portion of the form
25	application for leave to proceed in forma pauperis. The court will grant plaintiff one final
26	opportunity to submit the required trust account statement.
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Accordingly, plaintiff has 30 days from the date this order is served to submit the
required trust account statement. Failure to comply with this order will result in a
recommendation that this action be dismissed. The Clerk of the court is directed to send to
plaintiff a new form Application to Proceed In Forma Pauperis by a Prisoner.

So ordered.
