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1	II. CONDITIONS FOR RELEASE OF CONFIDENTIAL MATERIAL	
2	To enable defendants to use the confidential documents at trial, defendant agrees	
3	to release the confidential documents to Plaintiff's attorneys on the following conditions:	
4	1. The confidential material may be disclosed only to the following persons:	
5	(a) Counsel of record for plaintiff in this action;	
6	(b) Legal and non-legal staff employed or retained by counsel for plaintiff to	
7	whom it is reasonably necessary to disclose the information for this litigation;	
8	(c) Court personnel and stenographic reporters engaged in such proceedings as	
9	are incidental to the preparation for the trial in this action;	
10	(d) Any outside expert or consultant retained by plaintiffs' counsel for	
11	purposes of this action;	
12	(e) Witnesses during the preparation for trial and trial, provided that no	
13	witness may have copies of any of the confidential material, and each witness shall be informed	
14	and agree to be bound by the terms of this order. In no event may plaintiff or any other inmate	
15	have possession of any material that is subject to this stipulation.	
16	(f) The jury during the presentation of evidence and the jurors' deliberations.	
17	2. Plaintiff's counsel and legal and non-legal staff employed or retained by	
18	counsel for plaintiff shall not make copies of the confidential material except as necessary for	
19	purposes of this litigation.	
20	3. All confidential material in possession of plaintiff's counsel shall be destroyed	
21	or returned to defendant's counsel within 20 days of written request by defendants' counsel.	
22	4. Upon appropriate written request by defendants' counsel, plaintiff's counsel	
23	will provide written confirmation that the confidential material has been returned or destroyed.	
24	5. No confidential material provided to plaintiff's counsel shall be disclosed	
25	except as is necessary in connection with this or related litigation, including appeals, and not for	
26	any other purpose, including any other litigation.	
27	6. Nothing in this protective order is intended to prevent officials or employees of	
28	the State of California, or other authorized government officials, from having access to	
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1	confidential material to which they would have access in the normal course of their official	
2	duties.	
2	7. The provisions of this protective order are without prejudice to the right of any	
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4 5	party: (a) To apply to the court for a further protective order relating to any (a)

6	confidential material or relating to discovery in this litigation;	
7	(b) To apply to the court for an order removing the confidential material	
8	designation from any documents; or	
9	(c) To request confidential material be filed under seal, pursuant to the Local

11	of controlling precedent.	
12	8. Nothing in this stipulation is intended to prevent the parties from seeking to	
13	admit the confidential information into evidence.	
14	9. The provisions of this order shall remain in full force and effect until further	
15	order of this court.	
16	10. This order is not a trial protective order and does not approve the filing of any	
17	document under seal.
