## STIPULATION AND ORDER RE: HEARING ON PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION 1 Plaintiff BCFS-Health and Human Services and Defendants John A. Wagner and 2 3 Michelle M. Wong (collectively, the "Parties") hereby state and stipulate as follows: WHEREAS on November 9, 2010, the Court issued a Temporary Restraining Order as 4 requested by Plaintiff and issued an order extending the provisional license to operate a group 5 home through November 19, 2010; 6 7 WHEREAS on November 9, 2010, the Court issued an Order scheduling the hearing on 8 Plaintiff's Motion for a Preliminary Injunction for November 19, 2010 and setting a briefing schedule; 9 WHEREAS the Parties have negotiated in good faith to work toward a resolution of the 10 pending dispute and agree that an extension of time on the Motion for a Preliminary Injunction 11 12 is warranted and is in the interest of justice; 13 IN CONSIDERATION OF THE ABOVE, THE PARTIES, THROUGH THEIR RESPECTIVE ATTORNEYS OF RECORD, HEREBY STIPULATE that: 14 15 1. Effective immediately, Defendants, on behalf of the California Department of Social Services ("DSS"), hereby grant Plaintiff BCFS with a provisional license to operate its 16 facility in Fairfield until May 18, 2011; 17 18 2. Defendants will conduct a 90-day assessment of Plaintiff BCFS's facility in Fairfield and will issue a decision on BCFS's application for a permanent license on or before 19 February 18, 2011; 20 3. If Defendants deny BCFS's application for a permanent license, Defendants 21 agree that BCFS's provisional license will remain in place until May 18, 2011, but shall not be 22 23 construed to authorize the placement of any new minors; and 4. The hearing on Plaintiff's Motion for a Preliminary Injunction will be held, as a 24 regularly noticed motion, if necessary, after February 18, 2011. 25 /// 26
