ORDER

Plaintiff is a state prisoner proceeding without counsel in an action brought under 42 § 1983. He has once again requested that the court appoint counsel. As plaintiff has previously informed, district courts lack authority to require counsel to represent indigenters in section 1983 cases. *Mallard v. United States Dist. Court*, 490 U.S. 296, 298 (1989). In exceptional circumstances, the court may request an attorney to voluntarily to represent such aff. See 28 U.S.C. § 1915(e)(1); *Terrell v. Brewer*, 935 F.2d 1015, 1017 (9th Cir. 1991); *v. Housewright*, 900 F.2d 1332, 1335-36 (9th Cir. 1990). When determining whether tional circumstances” exist, the court must consider the likelihood of success on the as well as the ability of the plaintiff to articulate his claims pro se in light of the exity of the legal issues involved. *Palmer v. Valdez*, 560 F.3d 965, 970 (9th Cir. 2009).
