The ninety-day period within which to file a motion for substitution has expired, and no motion for substitution has been filed; nor has any other communication been made to the court by plaintiff's successor or representative.

Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed. Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(b).

These findings and recommendations are submitted to the United States District Judge assigned to this case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1). Within 14 days after being served with these findings and recommendations, any party, including plaintiff's successor or representative, may file written objections with the court and serve a copy on all parties. Such a document should be captioned "Objections to Magistrate Judge's Findings and Recommendations." Any response to the objections shall be filed and served within 14 days after service of the objections. The parties are advised that failure to file objections within the specified time may waive the right to appeal the District Court's order. Martinez v. Ylst, 951 F.2d 1153 (9th Cir. 1991).
