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The March 16, 2011, Order Setting Status (Pretrial Scheduling) Conference scheduled a status conference in this case on July 11, 2011, and required the parties to file a joint status report no later than fourteen (14) days prior to the scheduling conference. The March 16, 2011 Order further required that a status report be filed regardless of whether a joint report could be procured. No status report was filed as ordered.

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Therefore, Plaintiff is Ordered to Show Cause ("OSC") in a writing to be filed no later than 4:00 p.m. on July 8, 2011, why

sanctions should not be imposed against it and/or its counsel under Rule 16(f) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure for failure to file a timely status report. The written response shall also state whether Plaintiff or its counsel is at fault, and whether a hearing is requested on the OSC. If a hearing is requested, it will be held on August 1, 2011, at 9:00 a.m., just prior to the status conference, which is rescheduled to that date and time. A status report shall be filed no later than fourteen (14) days prior to the status conference.
