Two recent court orders were served on plaintiff's address of record and returned by the postal service with the notation that delivery had been refused. (Dkt. Nos. 16, 17.) Plaintiff is advised that failure to file objections within the specified time may waive the right to appeal the District Court's order. Martinez v. Ylst, 951 F.2d 1153 (9th Cir. 1991).
