Having carefully reviewed the entire 25 file, the court finds the findings and recommendations to be supported by the record and by 26 proper analysis. 1

Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that: 1. The findings and recommendations filed March 11, 2013, are adopted in full; 2. Respondent's motion to dismiss (ECF No. 16) is denied in part and granted in part, as follows: a. Denied on the ground that the petition is untimely; and b. Granted as to the following claims on the ground that they do not allege facts that, if proven, would constitute violations of due process: claims 2, 4, 5, 6 and that portion of claim 3 which alleges that an investigative employee or other staff assistant was not at the disciplinary hearing; and 3. This petition proceeds only as to claim 1 and that portion of claim 3 which alleges that no witnesses were present at his [petitioner's] disciplinary hearing.
