19	IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED by and between the parties through their undersigned		
20	counsel, subject to the approval of the Court, that Plaintiff be awarded attorney's fees under the Equal Access to Justice Act (EAJA), 28 U.S.C. § 2412(d), in the amount of THREE THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS AND NO CENTS (\$3,650). This amount

23	represents compensation for all legal services rendered on behalf of Plaintiff by counsel in		
24	connection with this civil action, in accordance with 28 U.S.C. § 2412(d).		
25	After the Court issues an order for EAJA fees to Plaintiff, the government will consider the matter of Plaintiff's assignment of EAJA fees to Plaintiff's attorney. Pursuant to <u>Astrue v.</u>		
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27	Ratliff, 130 S.Ct. 2521 (2010), the ability to honor the assignment will depend on whether the

1	Offset Program. After the order for EAJA fees is entered, the government will determine

13	Act attorney fees under 42 U.S.C. § 406, subject to the provisions of the EAJA.
