1	RECITALS
2	WHEREAS, the parties agreed to enter into mediation which was originally scheduled for
3	December 21, 2021 before Barbara Reeves of JAMS;
4	WHEREAS, on November 18, 2021, the Court approved the parties' stipulation to enter
5	into mediation (ECF No. 429);
6	WHEREAS, the parties mutually agreed to move the mediation date to January 5, 2021;
7	WHEREAS, the parties agreed that Plaintiff State of California ("California") would
8	provide certain additional information regarding the nature and scope of its claimed damages to
9	Rite Aid Corporation, Rite Aid Hdqtrs. Corp., and Thrifty Payless, Inc. ("Defendants") to
0	facilitate the mediation, which California provided on December 23, 2021;
1	WHEREAS, due to unforeseen personal circumstances, Defendants' statistical expert
2	became unavailable to analyze the above-referenced materials provided by California and prepare
3	for the January 5, 2021 mediation;
4	WHEREAS, pursuant to the October 29, 2021 stipulated order entered in this action (ECF
5	No. 427), Defendants identified additional pharmacy associates on December 15, 2021 whom
6	Defendants may potentially call as witnesses in this matter and whom Plaintiff State of California
7	("California") intends to depose;
8	WHEREAS, the parties have continued to schedule and conduct depositions of current
9	and former pharmacy associates on a rolling basis;
20	WHEREAS, California intends to depose approximately 16 additional current and former
21	pharmacy associates;
22	WHEREAS, California has issued a 30(b)(6) deposition notice on Defendants and has
23	expressed its intent to depose around 13 corporate fact witnesses;
24	WHEREAS, Defendants have issued a deposition subpoena on the Department of Health
25	Care Services and a 30(b)(6) deposition notice on the Division of Medi-Cal Fraud and Elder
26	Abuse;
27	WHEREAS, Defendants expect that at least 2 persons would testify on behalf of
28	Defendants regarding the listed subject matters in California's 30(b)(6) deposition notice;

WHEREAS, the Department of Health Care Services identified at least 8 persons who would testify regarding the subject matters in Defendants' deposition subpoena;

WHEREAS, the parties and the Department of Health Care Services are continuing to meet and confer regarding pending discovery;

WHEREAS, the parties recognize the remaining time and pending discovery tasks in order to comply with the current scheduling order; and

WHEREAS, the parties recognize the time and costs associated with litigation and the possibility of resolving the Government's False Claims Act causes of action by way of private mediation.

STIPULATION
