1	2. Absent an appropriation, Department of Justice attorneys and employees of the	
2	Social Security Administration are prohibited from working, even on a voluntary basis, except in	
3	very limited circumstances, including "emergencies involving the safety of human life or the	
4	protection of property." 31 U.S.C. § 1342.	
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6	3. Undersigned counsel therefore requests a stay of proceedings until Congress has	
7	restored appropriations to both the Department of Justice and the Social Security Administration.	
8	4. If this motion for a stay is granted, the Government requests that, when Congress	
9 10	has appropriated funds for the Department of Justice and the Social Security Administration, all	
10	current deadlines for the parties be extended commensurate with the duration of the lapse in	
12	appropriations.	
13	5. Opposing counsel has authorized the undersigned counsel to state that there is no	
14	objection to this motion.	
15	Therefore, although we greatly regret any disruption caused to the Court and the other	
16	litigants, the Acting Commissioner of Social Security hereby moves for a stay of proceedings in	
17	this case until Department of Justice and Social Security Administration attorneys are permitted	
18	to resume their usual civil litigation functions.
