



1 whether the fees are subject to any offset allowed under the United States Department of the  
2 Treasury's Offset Program. After the order for EAJA fees is entered, the government will determine  
3 whether they are subject to any offset.

4 Fees and costs shall be made payable to Plaintiff, but if the Department of the Treasury  
5 determines that Plaintiff does not owe a federal debt, then the government shall cause the payment of  
6 fees and costs to be made directly to plaintiff's counsel Joseph C. Fraulob, pursuant to the assignment  
7 executed by Plaintiff. Any payments made shall be delivered to Plaintiff's counsel Joseph C.  
8 Fraulob.

9 This stipulation constitutes a compromise settlement of Plaintiff's request for EAJA attorney  
10 fees and does not constitute an admission of liability on the part of Defendant under the EAJA.  
11 Payment of the agreed amount shall constitute a complete release from, and bar to, any and all claims  
12 that Plaintiff and/or Plaintiff's counsel may have relating to EAJA attorney fees connection with this  
13 action.
