24	Examination of the above-captioned actions reveals that they are related within the	
25	meaning of Local Rule 123(a). Here, "both actions involve similar questions of fact and the same	
26	question of law and their assignment to the same Judge or Magistrate Judge is likely to effect a	
27	substantial savings of judicial effort." Local Rule 123(a)(3). Accordingly, the assignment of

these matters to the same judge is likely to effect a substantial savings of judicial effort and is likely to be convenient for the parties. The parties should be aware that relating cases under Rule 123 causes the actions to be assigned to the same judge – it does not consolidate the actions. Under Rule 123, related cases are generally assigned to the judge and magistrate judge to whom the first filed action was assigned. As a result, it is hereby ORDERED that No. 2:14-cv-1489 WBS KJN is reassigned from Judge Shubb to the undersigned and from Magistrate Judge Newman to Magistrate Judge Brennan. Henceforth, the caption on documents filed in the reassigned case shall be shown as: No. 2:14-cv-1489 KJM EFB. It is further ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court make appropriate adjustment in the assignment of civil cases to compensate for this reassignment. IT IS SO ORDERED. DATED: September 17, 2014.
