17	Plaintiff's motion to compel (ECF No. 78) came on regularly for hearing April 27, 2016.	
18	Jason Takenouchi appeared for plaintiff. Ryan Erickson appeared for defendant. Upon review of	
19	the documents in support and opposition, upon hearing the arguments of counsel, and good cause	
20	appearing therefor, THE COURT FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:	
21	1. No later than May 2, 2016, defendant shall produce a privilege log for the documents	
22	withheld as described in the joint statement at ECF No. 103 at p. 15 (Joint Statement at 14:1-2).	
23	2. On the present record, the court finds that defendant does not have possession, custody,	
24	or control of the KPIT e-mail server located in India that contains the e-mails of the four	
25	custodians in dispute on this motion. The motion to compel further responses to request for	
26	production of documents nos. 75-78 is therefore denied.	
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3. Presently calendared for hearing on May 18, 2016 is plaintiff's motion for protective order. The motion is untimely under the current scheduling order. ECF. No. 69. The hearing on plaintiff's motion for protective order (ECF No. 108) is vacated.

4. Prior to the filing of any further motion to compel or other discovery motion, the parties shall engage in the informal procedures for the resolution of discovery disputes set forth on the undersigned's court website.
