The thirty-day period has 20 now expired, and plaintiff has not responded to the court's order and has not filed an in forma 21 pauperis affidavit or paid the appropriate filing fee. 22 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Clerk randomly assign a district court judge to this 23 case. 24 IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed without prejudice. 25 These findings and recommendations are submitted to the United States District Judge 26 assigned to the case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1). Within twenty-one days 27 after being served with these findings and recommendations, plaintiff may file written objections 28 with the court. Such a document should be captioned "Objections to Magistrate Judge's Findings 1

1	and Recommendations." Plaintiff is advised that failure to file objections within the specified
2	time may waive the right to appeal the District Court's order. Martinez v. Ylst, 951 F.2d 1153
3	(9th Cir. 1991).
