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4. Within fourteen (14) days from the date of this order, plaintiff shall submit to United States Marshal a completed summons, a completed USM-285 form, sufficient copies the summons and complaint for service of process in accordance with Federal Rule of Civil ocedure 4(i), and sufficient copies of the Scheduling Order and Order re Consent or Request for assignment issued in this case. Information regarding the number of copies currently required the United States Marshal may be obtained from the United States Marshals Service, 501 I eet, Suite 5600, Sacramento, CA 95814 (tel. 916-930-2030).

5. Within five (5) days after submitting the necessary documents to the United tes Marshal for service or process, plaintiff shall file in this court a declaration stating the date which the documents were submitted to the United States Marshal. Failure to file a timely claration may result in an order imposing appropriate sanctions.

6. The United States Marshal is directed to serve process and copies of the lersigned's Scheduling Order and Order re Consent or Request for Reassignment without payment of costs not later than sixty (60) days from the date of this order. Service of process ll be completed by delivering all necessary documents to the United States Attorney for the stern District of California and by sending copies of the summons, complaint and court orders registered or certified mail to the Attorney General of the United States at Washington, D.C. FED. R. CIV. P. 4(i)(1)(A) & (B). Copies of the summons, complaint and court orders shall be served by registered or certified mail on the Commissioner of Social Security, c/o Office the General Counsel, Region IX, 160 Spear Street, Suite 800, San Francisco, CA 94105-1545. FED. R. CIV. P. 4(i)(2).
