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20	STATUS (PRETRIAL SCHEDULING) ORDER
21	After reviewing the parties' Joint Status Report, the
22	court hereby vacates the Status (Pretrial Scheduling) Conference
23	scheduled for February 2, 2015, and makes the following findings
24	and orders without needing to consult with the parties any
25	further.
26	I. <u>SERVICE OF PROCESS</u>
27	The named defendant has been served, and no further
28	service is permitted without leave of court, good cause having
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been shown under Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 16(b). 1 2 JOINDER OF PARTIES/AMENDMENTS II. 3 No further joinder of parties or amendments to 4 pleadings will be permitted except with leave of court, good 5 cause having been shown under Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 6 16(b). See Johnson v. Mammoth Recreations, Inc., 975 F.2d 604 7 (9th Cir. 1992). 8 III. JURISDICTION/VENUE Jurisdiction is predicated upon diversity of 9 10 citizenship, 28 U.S.C. § 1332. Venue is undisputed and is hereby 11 found to be proper. 12 IV. DISCOVERY 13 The parties indicated that they served the initial 14 disclosures required by Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 26(a)(1) on December 10, 2014. Any initial disclosures that were not 15 16 served by that date shall be served no later than February 15, 17 2015. 18 The parties shall disclose experts and produce reports 19 in accordance with Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 26(a)(2) by no 20 later than October 16, 2015. With regard to expert testimony 21 intended solely for rebuttal, those experts shall be disclosed 22 and reports produced in accordance with Federal Rule of Civil 23 Procedure 26(a)(2) on or before November 16, 2015. 24 All discovery, including depositions for preservation 25 of testimony, is left open, save and except that it shall be so 26 conducted as to be completed by January 29, 2016. The word 27 "completed" means that all discovery shall have been conducted so 28 that all depositions have been taken and any disputes relevant to 2

discovery shall have been resolved by appropriate order if necessary and, where discovery has been ordered, the order has been obeyed. All motions to compel discovery must be noticed on the magistrate judge's calendar in accordance with the local rules of this court and so that such motions may be heard (and any resulting orders obeyed) not later than January 29, 2016.

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V. MOTION HEARING SCHEDULE

All motions, except motions for continuances, temporary 9 restraining orders, or other emergency applications, shall be 10 filed on or before March 18, 2016. All motions shall be noticed 11 for the next available hearing date. Counsel are cautioned to 12 refer to the local rules regarding the requirements for noticing 13 and opposing such motions on the court's regularly scheduled law 14 and motion calendar.

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VI. FINAL PRETRIAL CONFERENCE

The Final Pretrial Conference is set for May 23, 2016, at 2:00 p.m. in Courtroom No. 5. The conference shall be attended by at least one of the attorneys who will conduct the trial for each of the parties and by any unrepresented parties.

20 Counsel for all parties are to be fully prepared for 21 trial at the time of the Pretrial Conference, with no matters 22 remaining to be accomplished except production of witnesses for 23 oral testimony. Counsel shall file separate pretrial statements, 24 and are referred to Local Rules 281 and 282 relating to the 25 contents of and time for filing those statements. In addition to 26 those subjects listed in Local Rule 281(b), the parties are to 27 provide the court with: (1) a plain, concise statement which 28 identifies every non-discovery motion which has been made to the

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court, and its resolution; (2) a list of the remaining claims as 1 2 against each defendant; and (3) the estimated number of trial 3 days.

In providing the plain, concise statements of 4 5 undisputed facts and disputed factual issues contemplated by 6 Local Rule 281(b)(3)-(4), the parties shall emphasize the claims 7 that remain at issue, and any remaining affirmatively pled defenses thereto. If the case is to be tried to a jury, the 8 9 parties shall also prepare a succinct statement of the case, 10 which is appropriate for the court to read to the jury.

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VII. TRIAL SETTING

12 The jury trial is set for July 26, 2016, at 9:00 a.m. 13 The parties estimate that a jury trial will last seven days.

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SETTLEMENT CONFERENCE VIII.

15 A Settlement Conference will be set at the time of the 16 Pretrial Conference. All parties should be prepared to advise 17 the court whether they will stipulate to the trial judge acting 18 as settlement judge and waive disqualification by virtue thereof.

19 Counsel are instructed to have a principal with full 20 settlement authority present at the Settlement Conference or to 21 be fully authorized to settle the matter on any terms. At least 22 seven calendar days before the Settlement Conference counsel for 23 each party shall submit a confidential Settlement Conference 24 Statement for review by the settlement judge. If the settlement 25 judge is not the trial judge, the Settlement Conference 26 Statements shall not be filed and will not otherwise be disclosed 27 to the trial judge. ///

2	Any requests to modify the dates or terms of this
3	Scheduling Order, except requests to change the date of the
4	trial, may be heard and decided by the assigned Magistrate Judge.
5	All requests to change the trial date shall be heard and decided
6	only by the undersigned judge.
