The United States and claimant Christian Dapaah ("claimant") hereby stipulate
that a stay is necessary in the above-entitled action, and request that the Court enter an
order staying all further proceedings due to an on-going related criminal case against
claimant Christian Dapaah in Stanislaus County Superior Court <u>People v. Christian</u>
<u>William Dapaah</u>, Case Number 1469889. A Preliminary Hearing is presently scheduled
for January 26, 2016.

24 1. Claimant has filed a claim in this *in rem* forfeiture action, asserting he is the
25 legal and rightful owner of the defendant property in this action. ECF No. 6.

26 2. The stay is requested pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §§ 981(g)(1) and 981(g)(2). The
27 United States contends that the defendant currency was derived from or was intended to
28 be used in a violation of federal law, 21 U.S.C. § 841, et seq. (manufacture, distribute, or

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Stipulation and Order to Stay Further Proceedings dispense, or possess with intent to manufacture, distribute, or dispense, a controlled
 substance). Claimant denies these allegations.

3. The United States intends to depose claimant Dapaah regarding his claim 3 and the allegations as set forth in the complaint. If discovery proceeds at this time, 4 claimant will be placed in the difficult position of either invoking his Fifth Amendment 5 rights against self-incrimination and losing the ability to pursue his claim to the 6 Defendant Currency, or waiving his Fifth Amendment rights and submitting to a 7 deposition and potentially incriminating himself. If he invokes his Fifth Amendment 8 rights, the United States will be deprived of the ability to explore the factual basis for the 9 claim he filed with this court. 10

In addition, claimant intends to depose, among others, law enforcement
 involved with this and other investigations. Allowing depositions of the law enforcement
 officers at this time would adversely impact the ability of such law enforcement officers to
 investigate the alleged underlying criminal conduct.

5. The parties recognize that proceeding with this action at this time has
potential adverse effects on the criminal case and/or upon the claimant's ability to assert
any defenses to forfeiture. For these reasons, and because the parties are attempting to
settle the civil forfeiture case, the parties jointly request that these matters be stayed
until July 1, 2016, in accordance with the terms of this stipulation.

6. At that time the parties will advise the court of the status of the criminal investigation and will advise the court whether a further stay is necessary.
