Plaintiff has not, however, filed a certified copy of his prison trust account 20 statement for the six-month period immediately preceding the filing of the complaint. See 28 21 U.S.C. § 1915(a)(2). Plaintiff will be provided the opportunity to submit a certified copy of his 22 prison trust account statement. 23 In accordance with the above, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that: 24 1. Plaintiff shall, within thirty days after the filing date of this order, submit a certified 25 copy of his prison trust account statement for the six-month period immediately preceding the filing of the complaint.¹ 26 27 Plaintiff anticipates that he will be paroled on January 20, 2015. 2	from prison, see n.1, supra, he shall instead, within thirty days after the filing date of this order,
3	submit a completed in forma pauperis application for nonprisoners, included herewith.

5	a. Send plaintiff, together with a copy of this order, a blank in forma pauperis application
6	used by nonprisoners; and
7	b. To serve this order on plaintiff at both his current and anticipated addresses,
