17	Plaintiff, a state prisoner, proceeds pro se with a civil rights complaint filed pursuant to	
18	42 U.S.C. § 1983. By order of October 10, 2017, defendants were required to produce the	
19	assertedly privileged RVRs and medical reports responsive to plaintiff's Request for Production	
20	of Documents No. 7 for in camera review within 7 days. ECF No. 70. Defendants have	
21	complied with this order.	
22	Having reviewed the documents submitted for <i>in camera review</i> , the court concludes that	
23	they are only minimally relevant to this action, and the balancing of the potential benefits of	
24	disclosure against the potential disadvantages weighs against disclosure. See Sanchez v. City of	
25	Santa Ana, 936 F.2d 1027, 1033-34 (9th Cir. 1990), as amended on denial of reh'g (Feb. 27,	
26	1991), as amended on denial of reh'g (May 24, 1991) (internal citations and quotations omitted).	
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1	Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that the documents submitted for in camera review are not
2	required to be disclosed to plaintiff.
