In that order, the court informed plaintiff of the 19 deficiencies in his complaint. The twenty-eight day period has now expired, and plaintiff has not 20 filed an amended complaint or otherwise responded to the court's order. 21 Plaintiff has apparently decided to rest on the dismissed complaint. For the reasons given in the July 20, 2015, order, IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed with 22 23 prejudice. See Local Rule 110; Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(b). 24 These findings and recommendations are submitted to the United States District Judge 25 assigned to the case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(l). Within fourteen days 26 after being served with these findings and recommendations, plaintiff may file written objections 27 with the court. The document should be captioned "Objections to Magistrate Judge's Findings 28 and Recommendations." Plaintiff is advised that failure to file objections within the 1

1	specified time may waive the right to appeal the District Court's order. Martinez v. Ylst, 951
2	F.2d 1153 (9th Cir. 1991).
