

1	common to most prisoners, such as lack of legal education and limited law library access, do not
2	establish exceptional circumstances that warrant a request for voluntary assistance of counsel.
3	Having considered the factors under Palmer, the court finds that plaintiff has failed to
4	meet his burden of demonstrating exceptional circumstances warranting the appointment of
5	counsel at this time. Because there is no operative pleading on file, the court is unable to
6	determine the likelihood of success on the merits, and to date, plaintiff has been able to articulate
7	his claims. However, good cause appearing, the court will grant plaintiff a 60-day extension of
8	time to file objections and append a proposed amended complaint that complies with the March
9	20, 2018 order. No further extensions of time will be granted. Failure to timely comply with this
10	order will result in the findings and recommendations being referred to the district court for
11	review and adoption.
12	Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:
13	1. Plaintiff's motion for an extension of time (ECF No. 37) is granted;
14	2. Plaintiff is granted sixty days from the date of this order in which to file objections to
15	the findings and recommendations that are accompanied by a proposed amended complaint that
16	complies with the March 20, 2018 order; and
17	3. Plaintiff's motion for the appointment of counsel (ECF No. 37) is denied without
18	prejudice.
