ECF No. 9. As a result, plaintiff was ordered to pay 20 the required filing fee of \$350.00 plus the \$50.00 administrative fee within twenty-one days or 21 face dismissal of the complaint. Id. Twenty-one days have now passed and plaintiff has not paid 22 the required fees or otherwise responded to the order. 23 Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that the case be dismissed for failure to 24 pay the required filing and administrative fees. 25 These findings and recommendations are submitted to the United States District Judge 26 assigned to the case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1). Within twenty-one days 27 after being served with these findings and recommendations, plaintiff may file written objections 28 1

1	with the court. Such a document should be captioned "Objections to Magistrate Judge's Findings
2	and Recommendations." Plaintiff is advised that failure to file objections within the specified
3	time may waive the right to appeal the District Court's order. Martinez v. Ylst, 951 F.2d 1153
4	(9th Cir. 1991).
