17	Plaintiff, a state prisoner proceeding pro se, has filed a civil rights action pursuant to 42		
18	U.S.C. § 1983. On September 12, 2016, plaintiff was directed to complete the application form in		
19	support of his request to proceed in forma paupers. Plaintiff filed a request for leave to proceed in		
20	forma pauperis pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915; however, the second page of the application was		
21	missing. See 28 U.S.C. § 1915(a)(2). Plaintiff was provided an opportunity to submit the		
22	completed application in support of his application to proceed in forma pauperis on November 9,		
23	2016. (ECF No. 17.) Plaintiff was ordered to submit, within thirty days from the date of that		
24	order, a completed affidavit in support of his request to proceed in forma paupers. (Id.) Plaintiff		
25	was warned that failure to comply with the order would result in a recommendation that this		
26	action be dismissed without prejudice. (Id.)		
27	The thirty day deadline has long passed and plaintiff has not submitted the completed		
28	affidavit.

1	Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Clerk of Court randomly assign a	
2	United States District Judge to this action. IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that this action	
3	be dismissed without prejudice for failure to prosecute. See Local Rule 183(b).	
4	These findings and recommendations are submitted to the United States District Judge	
5	assigned to the case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(l). Within fourteen days	
6	after being served with these findings and recommendations, plaintiff may file written objections	
7	with the court. The document should be captioned "Objections to Magistrate Judge's Findings	
8	and Recommendations." Any response to the objections shall be filed and served within fourteen	
9	days after service of the objections. Plaintiff is advised that failure to file objections within the	
10	specified time may waive the right to appeal the District Court's order. Martinez v. Ylst, 951
