22	thirty days, the USM-285 forms and other documents necessary to effect service on defendants	
23	Hernandez and Mendoza. That thirty day period has passed, and plaintiff has not responded to	
24	the court's order. Accordingly, the court will recommend that this action be dismissed without	
25	prejudice under Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 41(b).	
26	In accordance with the above, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that plaintiff's motion for	
27	leave to file a third amended complaint (ECF No. 29) is denied; and

IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed without prejudice. See Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(b). These findings and recommendations will be submitted to the United States District Judge assigned to the case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1).
