BERRYHILL, JUSTICE ACT, 28 U.S.C. § 2412(d) 17 Acting Commissioner of Social Security, 18 Defendant. 19 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED by and between the parties through their undersigned 20 counsel, subject to the approval of the Court, that Plaintiff shall be awarded attorney fees and 21 expenses under the EAJA in the amount of THREE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED dollars 22 (\$3,800). This amount represents compensation for all legal services rendered on behalf of 23 Plaintiff, to date, by counsel in connection with this civil action, in accordance with 28 U.S.C. 24 § 2412. 25 After the Court issues an order for EAJA fees and expenses to Plaintiff, the government 26 will consider the matter of Plaintiff's assignment of EAJA fees and expenses to Plaintiff's 27 attorney. Pursuant to Astrue v. Ratliff, 560 U.S. 586 (2010), the ability to honor the assignment 28

1 will depend on whether the fees, expenses are subject to any offset allowed under the United 2 States Department of the Treasury's Offset Program. After the order for EAJA fees and expenses 3 is entered, the government will determine whether they are subject to any offset. 4 Fees and expenses shall be made payable to Plaintiff, but if the Department of the Treasury determines that Plaintiff does not owe a federal debt, then the government shall cause 5 6 the payment of fees to be made directly to Robert C. Weems, pursuant to the assignment executed 7 by Plaintiff. Any payments made shall be delivered to Plaintiff's counsel. 8 This stipulation constitutes a compromise settlement of Plaintiff's request for EAJA 9 attorney fees and expenses, and does not constitute an admission of liability on the part of 10 Defendant under the EAJA. Payment of the agreed amount shall constitute a complete release 11 from, and bar to, any and all claims that Plaintiff and/or Plaintiff's counsel may have relating to 12 EAJA attorney fees and expenses in connection with this action. 13 This award is without prejudice to the rights of Plaintiff's counsel to seek Social Security 14 Act attorney fees under 42 U.S.C. § 406, subject to the offset provisions of the EAJA. 15 Respectfully submitted December 8, 2017. 16 DATED: December 8, 2017 s/Robert C.
