17	Plaintiff is proceeding in this action pro se. Plaintiff has requested authority pursuant to	
18	28 U.S.C. § 1915 to proceed in forma pauperis. This proceeding was referred to this court by	
19	Local Rule 302(c)(21).	
20	Plaintiff has submitted the affidavit required by § 1915(a) showing that plaintiff is unable	
21	to prepay fees and costs or give security for them. Accordingly, the request to proceed in forma	
22	pauperis will be granted. 28 U.S.C. § 1915(a).	
23	In this action, plaintiff alleges claims arising out of the foreclosure of his home. The	
24	complaint alleges diversity as the basis for subject matter jurisdiction. In order to proceed under	
25	diversity jurisdiction, all defendants must be diverse to plaintiff. Plaintiff specifically alleges that	
26	defendant Countrywise Home Loans, Inc. has its principal place of business in the State of	
27	California. See ECF No. 1 at p. 7. As such, the parties are not diverse and this action may not	
28	proceed under diversity jurisdiction. 28 U.S.	C. § 1332(c)(1). There being no other evident basis 1

1	for subject matter jurisdiction, the court will recommend that this action be dismissed.	
2	Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that plaintiff's request to proceed in forma	
3	pauperis (ECF No. 2) is granted; and	
4	IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed for lack of subject	
5	matter jurisdiction.	
6	These findings and recommendations are submitted to the United States District Judge	
7	assigned to the case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(l). Within fourteen days	
8	after being served with these findings and recommendations, any party may file written	
9	objections with the court and serve a copy on all parties. Such a document should be captioned	
10	"Objections to Magistrate Judge's Findings and Recommendations." Failure to file objections	
11	within the specified time may waive the right to appeal the District Court's order. Martinez v.	
12	<u>Ylst</u> , 951 F.2d 1153 (9th Cir. 1991).
