ORDER

Plaintiffs Raul Zamudio and Soledad Zamudio are proceeding in this action pro se. This matter was referred to the undersigned in accordance with Local Rule 302(c)(21) and 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1). On August 24, 2022, the undersigned issued an order setting this matter for a Status (Pretrial Scheduling) Conference on October 7, 2022. (ECF No. 87.) On September 30, 2022 the undersigned continued the Status Conference to November 4, 2022. (ECF No. 92.) Review of the docket finds that the parties have not filed status reports addressing the issues necessary to conduct a Status Conference.

1 Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

2 1. The November 4, 2022 Status (Pretrial Scheduling) Conference is continued to **Friday,**
3 **December 9, 2022, at 10:00 a.m.**, at the United States District Court, 501 I Street, Sacramento,
4 California, in Courtroom No. 27, before the undersigned¹;

5 2. Plaintiffs shall file and serve status reports on or before **November 25, 2022**, and
6 defendant shall file and serve a status report on or before **December 2, 2022**. Each party's status
7 report shall address all of the following matters:

- 8 a. Progress of service of process;
- 9 b. Possible joinder of additional parties;
- 10 c. Possible amendment of the pleadings;
- 11 d. Jurisdiction and venue;
- 12 e. Anticipated motions and the scheduling thereof;
- 13 f. Anticipated discovery and the scheduling thereof, including
14 disclosure of expert witnesses;
- 15 g. Future proceedings, including the setting of appropriate cut-off
16 dates for discovery and for law and motion, and the scheduling of a
17 final pretrial conference and trial;
- 18 h. Modification of standard pretrial procedures specified by the rules
19 due to the relative simplicity or complexity of the action;
- 20 i. Whether the case is related to any other case, including matters in
21 bankruptcy;

21 ¹ Parties shall appear at the Status Conference either telephonically or over video conference
22 through the Zoom application (which is free and must be downloaded to your computer or mobile
23 device prior to the hearing). Parties proceeding in propria persona, on his or her own behalf, shall
24 contact Mamendella York, the courtroom deputy of the undersigned magistrate judge at (916)
25 930-4128, no sooner than 4 days prior to the noticed or continued hearing date but no later than
26 48 hours prior to the hearing, to arrange their appearance either telephonically or over video
27 conference. Counsel will receive an email containing the necessary appearance information and
28 must notify the courtroom deputy no later than 48 hours prior to the hearing to elect to appear
either telephonically or over video conference. The Zoom ID Number and password are
confidential and are not to be given to anyone. Persons granted remote access to these
proceedings, whether by Zoom or by telephone, are reminded of the general prohibition against
photographing, recording, and rebroadcasting of court proceedings. Violation of these
prohibitions may result in sanctions, restricted entry to future hearings, denial of entry to future
hearings, or any other sanctions deemed necessary by the court.

- j. Whether the parties will stipulate to the magistrate judge assigned to this matter acting as settlement judge, waiving any disqualification by virtue of her so acting, or whether they prefer to have a Settlement Conference before another magistrate judge;
- k. Whether the parties intend to consent to proceed before a United States Magistrate Judge; and
- l. Any other matters that may aid in the just and expeditious disposition of this action.

3. The parties are cautioned that failure to file a status report or failure to appear at the status conference may result in an order imposing an appropriate sanction. See Local Rules 110 and 183.
