20	Plaintiff was ordered to file a motion to lift the stay, accompanied by his proposed amended	
21	complaint within 90 days, and cautioned that his failure to comply would result in a	
22	recommendation that this action be dismissed without prejudice. Ninety days have now passed,	
23	and plaintiff has not filed a motion to lift the stay, and has not submitted a proposed amended	
24	complaint.	
25	Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the stay of this action (ECF No. 29) is	
26	lifted; and

IT IS RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed without prejudice. <u>See</u> Local Rule 110; Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(b).
