The thirty day period has now expired, and plaintiff has not responded to the court's order¹ and has not filed the required documents or paid the filing fee. 21 22 In accordance with the above, IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed without prejudice. 23 These findings and recommendations are submitted to the United States District Judge 24 25 assigned to the case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(l). Within fourteen days 26 ¹ Plaintiff filed an amended complaint, a notice of his alleged pending release in March of 2017, 27 and a supplement to his complaint, but none of these documents addressed the January 4, 2017 28 order. 1

after being served with these findings and recommendations, any party may file written objections with the court and serve a copy on all parties. Such a document should be captioned "Objections to Magistrate Judge's Findings and Recommendations." Any response to the objections shall be filed and served within fourteen days after service of the objections. The parties are advised that failure to file objections within the specified time may waive the right to appeal the District Court's order. Martinez v. Ylst, 951 F.2d 1153 (9th Cir. 1991).
