The thirty day period has now 18 19 expired, and plaintiff has not filed a third amended complaint or otherwise responded to the 20 court's order. 21 Although it appears from the file that plaintiff's copy of the order was returned, plaintiff 22 was properly served. It is the plaintiff's responsibility to keep the court apprised of his current address at all times. Pursuant to Local Rule 182(f), service of documents at the record address of 23 24 the party is fully effective. IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed without prejudice. See 25 26 Local Rule 110; Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(b). 27 These findings and recommendations are submitted to the United States District Judge 28 assigned to the case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(l). Within fourteen after

1	being served with these findings and recommendations, plaintiff may file written objections with
2	the court. The document should be captioned "Objections to Magistrate Judge's Findings and
3	Recommendations." Plaintiff is advised that failure to file objections within the specified time
4	waives the right to appeal the District Court's order. Martinez v. Ylst, 951 F.2d 1153 (9th Cir.
5	1991).
