15	IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED by the parties, through their undersigned attorneys, and		
16	with the approval of the Court as provided below, that Plaintiff be awarded attorney fees under		
17	the Equal Access To Justice Act (EAJA) 28 U.S.C. 2412(d), in the amount of three thousand,		
18	eight hundred, thirty-nine dollars and eighty-three cents (\$3839.83). This amount represents		
19	compensation for all legal services rendered on behalf of Plaintiff by his counsel in connection		
20	with this civil action, in accordance with 28 U.S.C. 2412(d).		
21	After the Court issues an order for EAJA fees to Plaintiff, the government will consider		
22	the matter of Plaintiff's assignment of EAJA fees to Plaintiff's attorney. Pursuant to <u>Astrue v.</u>		
23	Ratliff, 130 S.Ct. 2521 (U.S. June 14, 2010), the ability to honor the assignment will depend on		
24	whether the fees are subject to any offset allowed under the United States Department of the		
25	Treasury's Offset Program. After the order to EAJA fees is entered, the government will		
26	determine if it is subject to any offset.		
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Fees and costs shall be made payable to Plaintiff, but if the Department of the Treasury determines that Plaintiff does not owe a federal debt, then the government shall cause the

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payment of fees and costs to be made directly to Plaintiff's counsel Joseph C. Fraulob, pursuant to the written assignment executed by Plaintiff. Any payments shall be delivered to Plaintiff's 2 counsel Joseph C. Fraulob. 3

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This stipulation constitutes a compromise settlement of Plaintiff's request for EAJA attorney fees and does not constitute an admission of liability on the part of Defendant under the EAJA. Payment of the agreed amount shall constitute a complete release from, and bar to, any and all claims that Plaintiff and/or Plaintiff's counsel may have relating to EAJA attorney fees in connection with this action.
